

# Bill Goes To Rocky

ALBANY, N.Y. (UPI)—Governor Rockefeller, who favors conservative business suits for himself, has a bill before him today that would allow local school boards to set dress codes for students.

The measure passed the Senate Thursday.

The legislation, which passed 43-13 after approval in the Assembly last month, comes in the wake of a controversial decision by Education Commissioner Ewald B. Nyquist. Nyquist said that schools cannot, on their own, determine attire in the classroom because it violated students' rights.

Nyquist's son was once suspended from a suburban Albany school for having his hair too long. The suspension came before his father's ruling on the matter.

"The courts have generally ruled in favor of the students, frustrating attempts by school authorities to realistically regulate appearances and attire of the attending students," Sen. John Dunne, R-Garden City, sponsor of the bill, said. "The regulation of school dress of students by school authorities is an important incident to maintaining a code of conduct and behavior within a school system which will result in orderly conduct on the part of the student body."

The bill provides that boards of education or trustees of a school district can set standards as to personal appearance and attire for students which relate to health and safety and the "full participation of the students in school activities."

In his ruling, Nyquist said that "the matter of a student's appearance may not be regulated by administrative order where fashion or taste is the sole criteria."

"Regulations must relate to a specific educational purpose, such as health, safety or full participation in various activities," he said. "The imposition of a penalty for failure to conform to a uniform manner of dress or appearance violates the individual rights of students and parents."

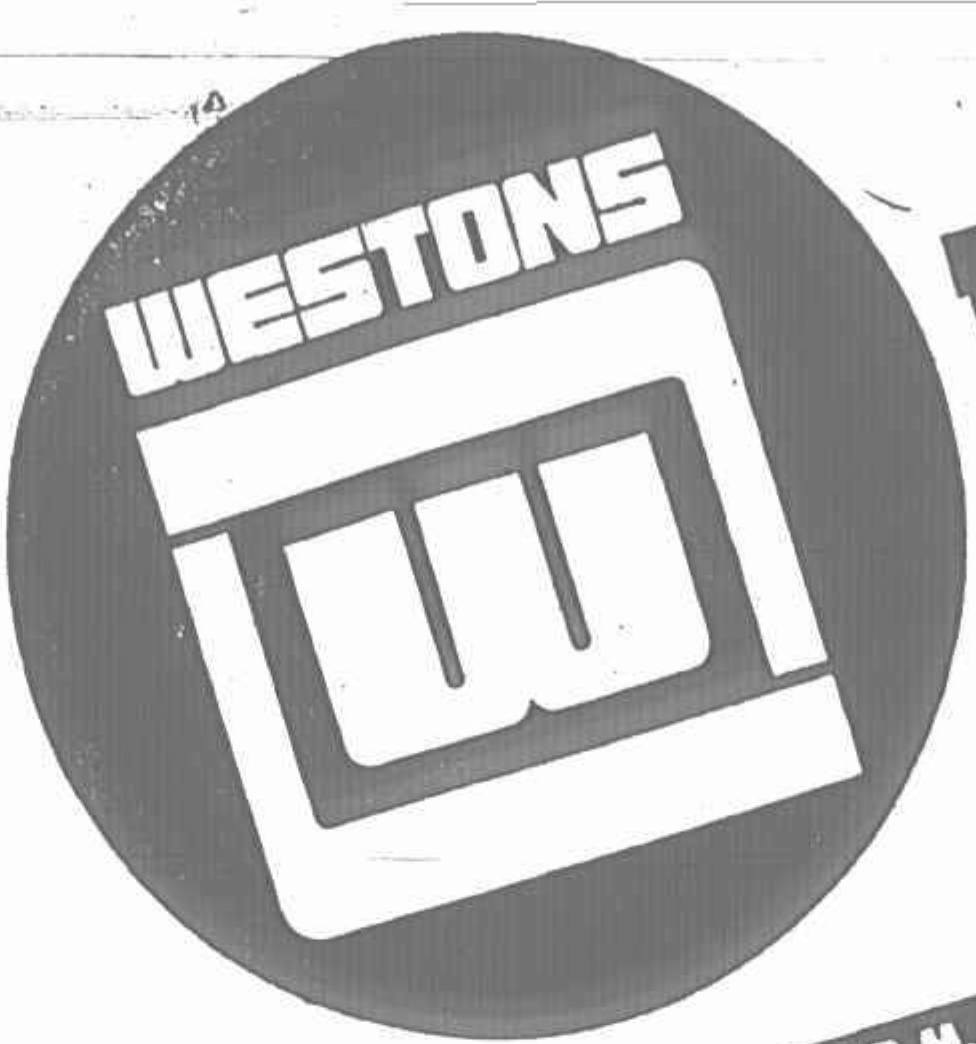
According to an announcement made by Obolensky's office here, the couple was secretly married near Washington by Judge Frank E. Thomas Jr.

Obolensky, who specializes in public relations and hotel management, met Mrs. Wall last year.

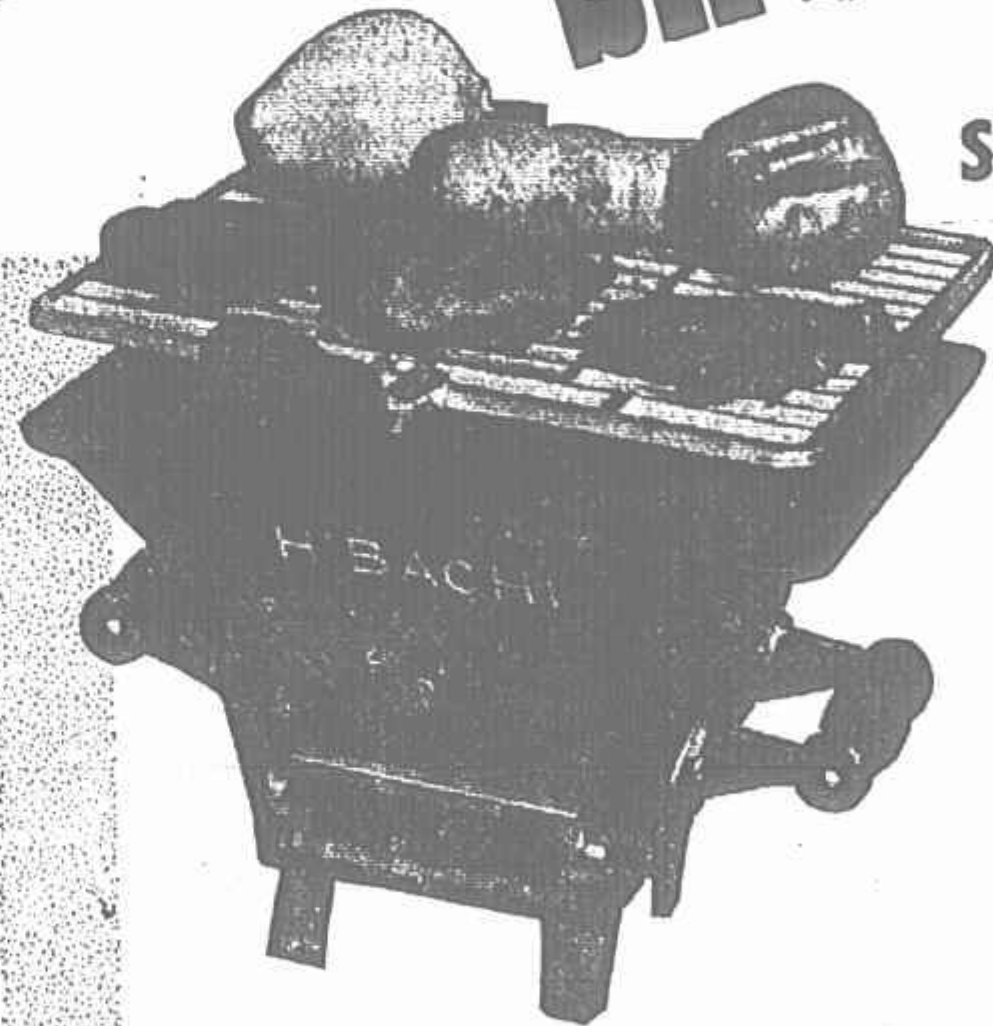
